of Chemistry, and chair or member of a number of committees for the National Research Council of the National Academy of Sciences. He is a member of the advisory board for the Tulane University School of Science and Engirneering. In 2009, he was chair of the Council of Scientific Society Presidents.

On behalf of OxyChem he has chaired numerous committees for industry associations, including the American Chemistry Council and the Vinyl Institute. He has served on expert groups commissioned by the United Nations Environment Programme, the US Environmental Protection Agency and three states—most recently the California Green Ribbon Science Panel.

Bill holds two patents, and has over sixty publications in the fields of organic electrochemistry, polymer chemistry, combustion chemistry, incineration and plastics recycling.

Bill has received the Henry Hill Award, sponsored by the ACS Division of Professional Relations, the Michael Shea Award from the Division of Chemical Technicians, Distinguished Alumni Awards from both Indiana and DePauw University and the Vinyl Institute's Roy T. Gottesman Leadership Award for lifetime achievement.

And he is now the winner of the Santa Clara Valley Section's highest award, the Harry and Carol Mosher award. This award was established in 1980 by our Section to:

- 1. Recognize and encourage outstanding work in chemistry,
- 2. Advance chemistry as a profession, and
- 3. Recognize service to ACS.

The award is named for the late Dr. Harry S. Mosher of Stanford University, and Dr. Carol W. Mosher of the Stanford Research Institute International, Menlo Park, husband and wife and charter members and long-time supporters of this Section.

The award currently consists of an engraved plaque and a check for \$2000. Bill has very generously decided to donate his stipend back to our Section to support the Community College Teacher Scholar Award, for which he receives our heartfelt thanks.

The first scientists to receive this award were Drs. Harry and Carol Mosher themselves in recognition of the inspiration of their example. The committee noted that the Moshers, including a brother, Dr. William A. Mosher, also a chemist, are outstanding examples of the qualities to be recognized and honored by this award.

Election 2011

Our 2011 election ended after the December issue of this newsletter went to press. For a change, we had two contested elections (Councilor and Alternate Councilor). This was mainly due to our loss of a Councilor and an Alternate Councilor seat, ordered by National. Their decision is based upon demographics. Nevertheless, we still only got 312 votes, which is 9.4% of the electorate, and 18 fewer than last year, when all races were uncontested.

As we do every year, we have a new Chair Elect (Peter Rusch). Both the Treasurer (Ihab Darwish) and the Secretary (Karl Marhenke) were re-elected. All three of the Councilors whose terms expired at the end of 2011 ran for re-election; only two could be re-elected, and the winners were Abby Kennedy and Ean Warren. The Alternate Councilor race was in the same situation; we had a resignation, but we also had a NEW CANDIDATE (that sound you hear is the Executive Committee applauding), Lisa Milstein, and she was elected, and David Parker was re-elected.

We thank everyone who voted, and we hope that our electronic election, managed by Vote-Now, was as easy for you as it was for us. The continuing members of the Executive Committee also thank those who voted for the implied vote of confidence in the volunteer work we do for the Section.

The most important requirements for Executive Committee ("ExComm") membership are (1) membership in the Santa Clara Valley Section of the ACS and (2) willingness to serve. If you're interested, you should come to our dinner meetings; most of the current ExComm members attend most of those and showing up is a good way to meet them and get to know them, and they you. Any of us will be glad to describe what being a member of the ExComm involves. Also, visitors are always welcome at our ExComm meetings; the times and places are listed near the bottom of our home page at www.scvacs.org. For some time now we've been meeting at 7:30 p.m. on the first Monday of the month at PARC in Palo Alto, on Coyote Hill Road not far from the Stanford campus. Meetings typically last until 9:30.

Our Nominations and Elections committee puts names on the ballot based upon interest and willingness to serve, or, for incumbents, willingness to continue to serve.

Thus you have to find a way to be active in Section activities and attract the notice of the committee.

Our Section is designated by the national office as "large". However, since the last census period, we have lost membership compared to other Sections, and we now have seven Councilors, and seven Alternate Councilors (through 2011, we had 8 of each). That's fourteen people, and three of the five officers are also either Councilors or Alternate Councilors. So, despite the fact that Section membership is still well over 3000, all we have

been able to do is get 16 people to fill 19 slots! Getting volunteers for ongoing work isn't easy!

The only viable way to be elected is to get your name listed on the ballot. The national bylaws require Sections to hold elections, even if the races are non-contested. We are also required to allow for write-in votes, but the fact is that no one has ever come remotely close to being elected that way. Besides being placed on the ballot by the Nominations and Elections committee, the only way to get there is through a petition.

At least one past Section Chair not only ran, but was elected in precisely this way. Only 15 signatures (one can even be the candidate's own) of Section members are needed. You send the petition to the Secretary, and you're on the ballot.

We're a 100% volunteer organization. None of us is paid for what we do, and we have no paid employees. Volunteers are always welcome. The work is interesting, fun, and rewarding. We invite you to join us!

Western Regional Meeting

November 10-12, 2011 Pasadena, CA

The 43rd Annual Western Regional meeting was held in Pasadena on November 10-12, 2011. It was hosted by the Southern California local section on the 100th anniversary of their founding. Over 500 people attended the meeting. The meeting key note presentation featured a symposium, sponsored by the Beckman Center at Caltech celebrating the legacy of

Arnold Beckman. Dr. Leroy Hood, President and Co-founder of the Institute of Systems Biology, Seattle Washington gave the keynote address. One of the innovative features of this meeting was a "speed dating" session in which undergraduate students were given an opportunity to meet with ACS chemists. There were 13 tables, each manned by 2-3 chemists, and the students moved from table to table, spending about 10 minutes networking with the chemists. This was a highly successful session and one that we may reestablish at our upcoming meeting.

We applaud the Southern CA section on their 100th anniversary, and on the successful Western Regional meeting. As regular readers of the Santa Clara Valley newsletter know, our section will be co-hosting the next Western Regional Meeting during October, 2013. We plan to build on the excellent precedent established by the Southern CA section as we work towards our meeting.


